2. Re-visit verses 7-9. What are the four things God says He is aware of?
3. What are the specific ways God says about how He will rescue His people?
4. What, if any, principles in these verses still apply to us today?
5. When Moses returned to Egypt, it would have felt different than when he grew up there. He had a new identity, one that was not just Egyptian. What do you think it was like for Moses as he returned, now a stranger in a place he used to live? In what ways are believers like Moses, living as a stranger in a familiar land?
6. What do you struggle with most when it comes to living missionally? What does it look like to lean on the Holy Spirit to accomplish the work Jesus has called you to?
